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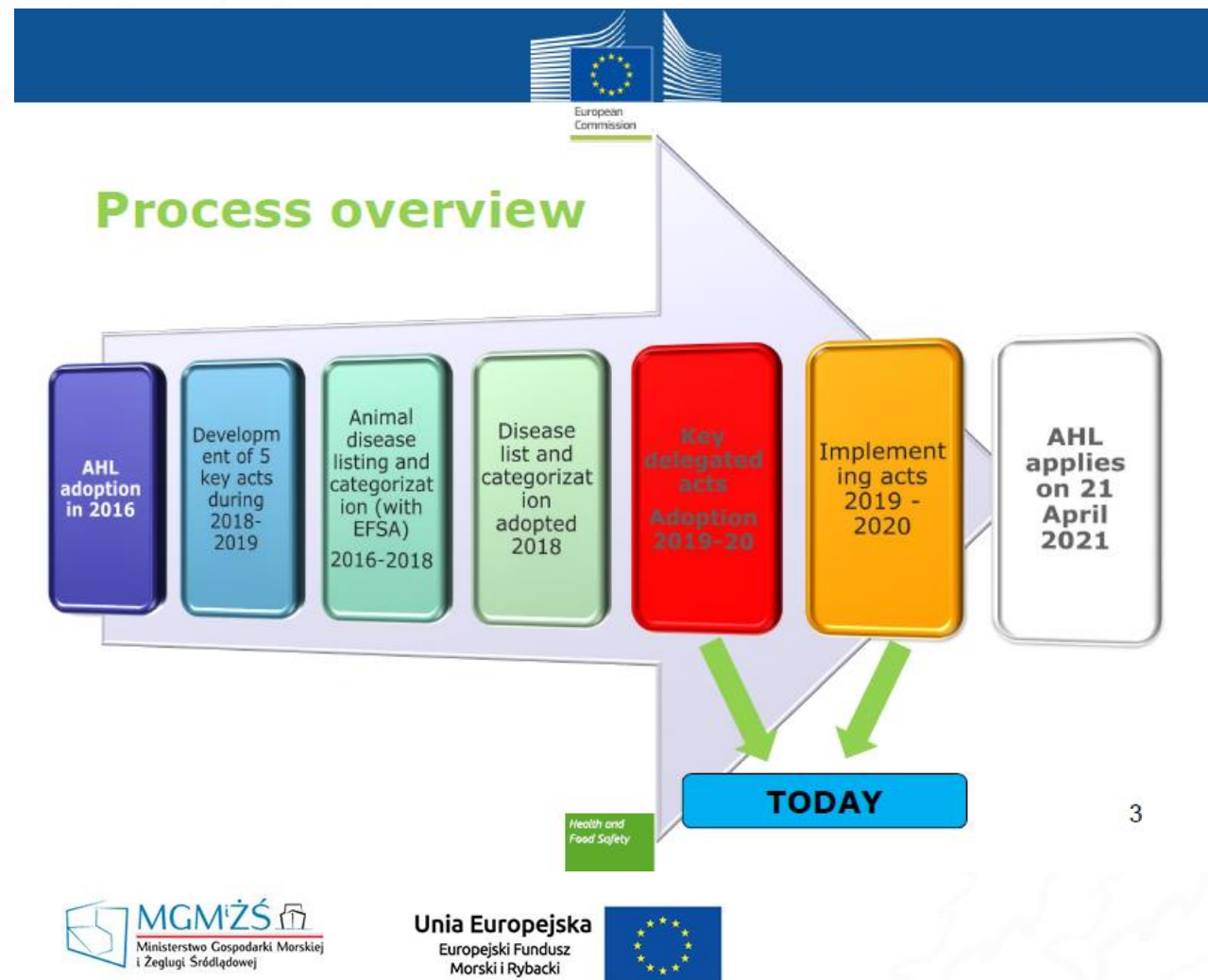

Regulation (EU) 2016/429 on transmissible animal diseases "Animal Health Law"

- huge number of legal acts are streamlined into a single law
- key priorities: preventing and eradicating disease
- responsibilities are clarified for farmers, vets and others dealing with animals
- use of new technologies for animal health activities - surveillance of pathogens, electronic identification and registration of animals
- early detection & control of animal diseases, including emerging diseases
- flexibility to adjust rules to local circumstances, and to emerging issues such as climate and social change
- sets out a legal basis for monitoring animal pathogens resistant to antimicrobial agents supplementing existing/other rules

From Council Directive 2006/88/EC to AHL

- Dir. 2006/88

Minimum control measures in the event of a suspicion or outbreak of certain diseases

Preventive measures

Placing on the market and imports

Health status of Member States and other EEA Countries, zones or compartments

National Authorities

- Infection with HPR- deleted ISAV
- Koi herpes virus (KHV)

Epizootic Haematopoietic Necrosis (EHN) – former Exotic	A	Rainbow Trout Redfin Perch
Viral Haemorrhagic Septicaemia (VHS)	C	Trouts, Salmons, Charrs, Turbot, ...
Infectious Haematopoietic Necrosis (IHN)	C	Trouts, Salmons, Charrs
Infectious Salmon Anemia (ISA) (<i>HPR deleted</i>)	C	Atlantic Salmon, Rainbow & Brown Sea Trout

AHL Part I Disease listing (finfish)

Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2018/1882

NOTES:

- **Category A** approximates to “exotic” under Dir 2006/88/EC
- **Category C** approximates to “non-exotic” under Dir 2006/88/EC with some differences
- **KHV** was “non-exotic” under Dir 2006/88/EC but now Category E– ‘diseases for which there is a need for surveillance’
- MS can take **national measures under Article 226** (AHL) - Similar to Article 43 of Dir 2006/88 “national measures” diseases which constitute a significant risk in a particular MS

Susceptible & vector species will be reviewed during 2020 after deliberations of OIE ad hoc groups are examined



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AHL Part II

Surveillance, eradication programmes, disease freedom

Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/690

- **Notification** of suspicion of presence of listed and emerging diseases - required in all cases
- **Investigation** of abnormal mortalities & other signs of serious disease – or significant decreased production rates with an undetermined cause- required in all cases
- **Risk based surveillance:** - required in certain approved establishments/ simplified approach set out details of risk factors to be taken into account when categorising establishments - ‘high’, ‘medium’ or ‘low’ risk.
- **Disease-freedom** may be achieved at MS/zone/compartment level
- Simplified procedure for **declaration of certain disease-free zones and compartments**



AHL Part III

Disease control measures

Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/687

- Set out in detail for Category A diseases – measures to be taken by operators and competent authorities:
 - on suspicion
 - on confirmation
- Cross references to control measures for Category B & C diseases which are set out in the DA under Part II of the AHL ([Regulation \(EU\) 2020/690](#))

AHL Part IV.II

Registration and approval of establishments

Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/691

- Basic requirement for aquaculture establishments is registration but certain higher risk aquaculture establishments need to be approved
- Derogations from the requirement for approval for certain establishments are set out in Regulation (EU) 2016/ 429 and other proposals for additional derogations are set out in the DA under Part IV.II
- AHL and DA set out requirements for operators of registered establishments - *notification, investigation, basic record keeping*
- AHL and DA set out requirements for operators of approved establishments *notification, investigation, record keeping, biosecurity measures, facilities & equipment, in certain cases participation in an RBS scheme*

AHL Part IV.II

Registration and approval of establishments

Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/691

- Several types of establishments require approval
- Specific requirements for approval depend on the type of establishment but in general, will include at least two of the following:
 - Risk based surveillance
 - Biosecurity measures
 - Facilities and equipment
- Risk based surveillance (RBS): more targeted application of RBS than that set out in Directive 2006/88/EC and more suitable for detection of emerging diseases

AHL Part IV.II

Movements of aquatic animals and products within the Union

Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/990

- Rules for movements of aquatic animals within the EU are broadly similar to those set out in Directive 2006/88/EC; movements shall not jeopardise the health status at the place of destination with regard to listed or emerging diseases •
- New requirement for self declaration documents for movements between Member States in cases where certification is not required
- Self declaration documents relating to surveillance programmes will have relevant health attestations
- Format for certificates to be set out in an IA under the AHL and Article 90 of Regulation (EU) 2017/625
